Brady, carried away about \$150.00 and Mr. Brady got the first place in the doubles, and while there was no prize offered for high average, it is believed that Mr. Brady took that distinction too. The shoot was well conducted and the locals have nothing but praise for the mining management. Captain Parker, the professional, shot with the La Grande team for targets only. First money was frequently the lot of the home people at the shoot and the city of La Grande came away with colors flying.
