# BUTTER MOVES UP A NOTCH

## PORTLAND WHOLESALEERS NEED MORE SUPPLY.

Brisk Trading in Butter Lifts Price Five Cents Per Roll.

Butter took a five cent raise on one and two pound rolls this morning, going to 49 and 75 cents on the retail market. Butter has had a stability all summer and but few fluctuations have been noted heretofore. A stiff breeze has been set of late in the Portland price-establishing marts, the demand invariably being a little more brisk than the supply. Market quotations today follow:
