EXCHANGE FOR EGGS, BUTTER

EXCHANGE FOR BUTTINES PORTLAND DEALERS WILL START MOVEMENT.

Urgent Need of Conducting Exchange in Portland Pointed Out.

Local shippers of butter, eggs and other produce to Portland where no exchange exists, will be elated to hear that an effort to establish such an exchange is going on there. Witnesseth the Portland Journal:

Owing to the unsatisfactory basis for doing business in the butter, egg and cheese trade at this time, it is probable that another strong attempt will be made to establish an exchange here.

An attempt was made some time ago by some of the leading interests but the plan was downed by an eastern importer who did not want the trade to get together and find the real basis for prices.

Such an exchange conducted in the proper manner would be a great benefit to producers as well as wholesalers because it would establish prices daily by actual selling and offering. Under the proposed rules only actual transactions can be taken as a market basis, and this would do away with much of the manipulation that is shown from time to time in the trade.

The establishment of the exchange would likewise produce much benefit by forcing buyers and sellers to trade on a graded market. On such an exchange the eggs would be graded and the shipper who has large, clean and strictly fresh gathered eggs would receive more than the one with ordinary quality. At present both get the same price in the market, therefore, no benefits are derived from turning out a better article.
