LITTLE CHANGE FROM LAST WEEK'S FIGURES.

Red Peppers Bring 15c Lb., Egg Plant Selling at 10c Each.

Conditions in the local markets are very stable at present, and have been unusually steady for several weeks, especially in the fruit and vegetable departments. There are but few changes from last week's prices.

Roasting ears of fresh corn are selling as low as 15 cents per dozen, but the price of 20 cents still holds in most cases. Red peppers bring 15 cents per pound; and egg plants are selling at 10 cents each.
