**ROLLED BARLEY DROPS 5c; NOW SELLS FOR \$1.50 PER CWT.**

**Mills Start on New Grain, but Feed Prices Remain Unchanged.**

Feed and grain in the local markets have remained practically unchanged for the past several weeks. Rolled barley sloughed off five cents and is now selling for \$1.50 per hundred pounds. Oats are selling in the local feed market at \$1.60. Although the mills have begun the handling of the new grain crop bran and shorts remain unchanged in price. Bran is selling at \$1.30 and shorts demand \$1.40 per cwt.

**Seattle Does Homage.**  
Seattle, Sept. 10.—Roosevelt today received the greatest demonstration yet accorded him on his swing around the circle. Facing an audience cheering him to the echo in Dreamland rink he characteristically detailed "His Taking of the Panama Canal."

"The older I get, the more progressive I'm becoming," he asserted in his speech. An automobile parade through the city between sidewalks lined with cheering thousands was the forerunner of a tremendous reception at the Dreamland rink. All along the line from Spokane, crowds turned out until late last night and again early in the morning to catch a glimpse of the colonel. Roosevelt defended his course in obtaining the Panama canal zone. In the Dreamland rink speech he said if he had followed the usual course the canal would have been 50 years in the future.

"I never acted like a dictator," said Roosevelt. "I came to the conclusion that someone was trying to hold up Uncle Sam and so I took the zone."

"The Panama canal could not have been built," said Roosevelt, "if the American people did not have the ability to look without as well as within. I loathe a bully and a braggart and I loathe the nation that takes the same stand, but I'm glad now we have the

canal there and are fortifying it. If I were asked to name the greatest service I rendered in the interests of peace I am not sure I would name the thing for which I received the Noble prize (the only American to receive it)—I'm not sure I would name the settlement of the Russo-Japanese war, but I believed would name the sending of the battleship fleet around the world."
