TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 7th day of August, 1912, creating improvement district No. 67 and designating Y avenue as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 7th day of August, 1912, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that said portion of Y avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon macadam roadway, 40 feet in width, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made, that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of Y avenue, from the east line of North Fir street to the west line of North Spruce street. 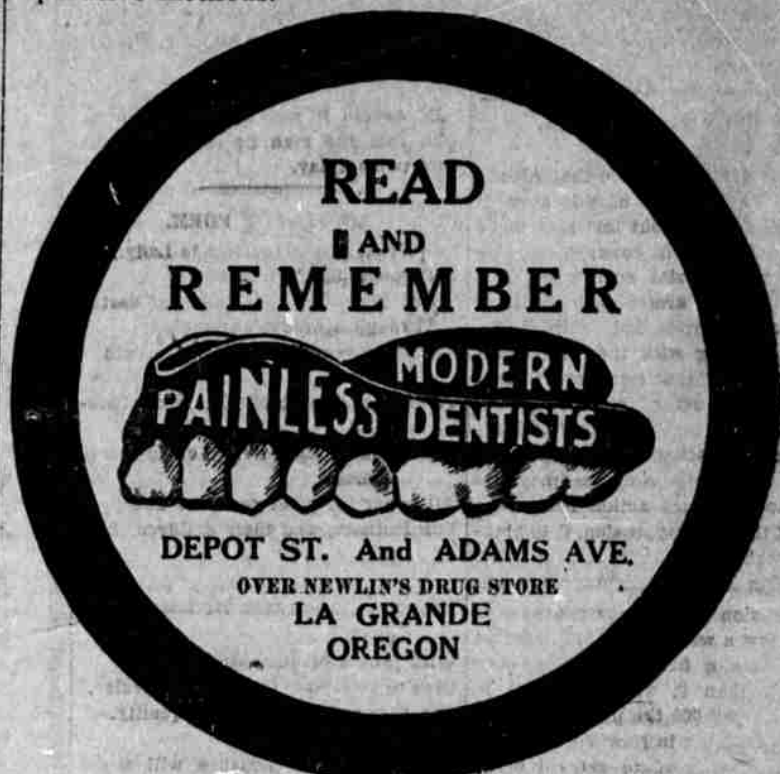
