BOOSTED PRICES FOR STOCK HOLD

EXTREMELY HIGH PRICES ON ALL STOCK REMAIN FIRM

Little Change in Several Weeks and Reports Foretell No Slide.

In the local markets, as throughout the Northwest in general, the extremely high prices for live stock are still being paid to the stockmen. Reports coming from all sides indicate that the present prices are likely to continue indefinitely.

Several sales have been made during the last week where light hogs have demanded 8½ cents, and the standard price of 1-4 cent less has been paid for all of good quality. The beef prices vary slightly according to the condition of the stock but hug the quoted prices in all instances.

The price on poultry is the same as last week. Quotations in the local markets for today are as follows:
