LOCAL MARKETS CHANGE LITTLE

STRING BEANS AND GREEN ONIONS PRACTICALLY OUT OF SEASON.

Week Sees Little Change in Local Fruit and Vegetable Conditions.

As has been characteristic of all products in the local markets for the past several weeks, the conditions in the local fruit and vegetable markets are about the same as at the first of the week.

String beans and green onions are now practically out of the markets for this year. Old onions are selling at \$2.00 per hundred pounds, and for 2½ cents per lb. in small lots.

Grapes of the best quality are now in the markets at 10 cents per pound. Concord grapes are selling for 40¢ per basket and Tokay grapes for 60¢ per basket.
