CHANGES TODAY IN MARKETS FEW

TOMATOES DROP TO FOUR POUNDS FOR 25 CENTS

Turnips Enter Markets Selling at 2 1/2 Cents Per Pound.

Changes in the local markets for today are few. The vegetable season is in the latter part of its glory. Many of the early articles in the lists have been dropped, and as the season advanced others took their places; but now comes the time when the reserve articles are not so plentiful and conditions foretell the time of the year when "green stuff" and fresh fruit will be an unusual luxury instead of a common relish.

Tomatoes are now selling at four pounds for 25 cents; fresh roasting ears of corn for 15 cents per dozen. Turnips are in the markets selling at 2 1/2 cents per pound.
