HOG PRICES SETTLED AGAIN

SHARP CUTTING OF RECENT DAYS IS ENDED.

Prices Now Lower in Portland Than in Chicago.

*** SLIGHT DECLINE IN MEATS. ***
The present week has seen a very slight decline in La Grande pork quotations, cows and hives in general remaining stable and firm.

Portland, Sept. 24.—A market announcement said last night:

of live hog prices in the Portland. Notwithstanding the sharp cutting yards, local packers continue to maintain former extreme high prices for provisions. The market here for hogs recently showed the heaviest decline known for some years. In the natural course of events there is generally a similar trend of pickled product prices but no such change has as yet been announced.

The local price on provisions is based upon the price of the product at Chicago with the freight from there added but the price of hogs is made by the local supply and demand. At the present time, while hams and other smoked products are higher here than in Chicago, the price of hogs is lower.

Lowering the price of smoked meat would be a great aid in stimulating the industry here as it would suit out the huge amount of Eastern products that annually comes to the Pacific coast. At the present time Eastern packers find this a very good market because the price is similar to that found at their home place, plus the freight.

For extra quality the cattle market is firmer. W. I. Dishman had some extra good steers that went at \$7, while some extra fancy heifers sold late in the day at \$6.50. Calves struck a new high mark at \$8.50. The calves were from E. Davis of Dubois, Idaho. "They were extra good stuff," says R. B. Caswell of Kidwell & Caswell, who made the sale.
