MRS. CROSS' RELATIVE DEAD.

Prominent Politician of New York Passes Away—Prominent Attorney.

Mrs. Ellen H. Cross of this city has been advised of the death of her cousin, George Straight, at Cattaraugus, N. Y. A son, Charles D. Straight, anticipates coming to La Grande to visit Mrs. Cross in the near future.

An Eastern press dispatch says of the death of Mr. Straight:

Salamanca, September 24.—George Straight, for many years a well known resident of Cattaraugus and at one time prominent in the Republican politics of this county, died at 9:45 o'clock yesterday morning at his home in Cattaraugus. He is survived by two sons, Charles D. Straight, editor of the Olean Times, and John Straight, who has been in Washington for the last nine years.

Mr. Straight was born near Hamlet, Chautauquus county, in 1836, and received his education in the common Chamberlain institute. Taking up the study of law with Judge Snow of Fredonia, he continued with Daniel Sherman of Forestville, the latter at that time the most prominent attorney in northern Chautauquus county. In 1860 he was principal of the Cattaraugus school, and the next year was admitted to the bar. Soon after this he was married to Helen J. Darling, daughter of John P. Darling, then state senator. After practicing at his profession for some time, he formed a partnership with Dr. F. W. Y. P. ed a partnership with Mr. Darling & Straight, and the firm conducted a general store at Cattaraugus. He continued to practice law while engaged in business.

Mr. Straight was postmaster at Cattaraugus for three terms, during the administrations of Presidents Lincoln, Grant and Hayes, and was for several years active in politics.
