Jews Observe Feast of Tabernacles.

New York, Sept. 25:—At sunset this evening the members of the Jewish faith throughout the world begin the observance of the Feast of the Tabernacles. The day is called in Hebrew "Succoth" and falls upon the 15th day of the month of Tishri in the Hebrew calendar. The feast lasts eight days and ends with the "day of solemn assembly." The festival is sometimes called the Feast of the Harvest, from the fact that it comes in Autumn, at a time when the husbandmen in Palestine had safely garnered the product of his lands.
