That and the blasting of an honorable man's reputation is the theme of "The Lion and the Mouse," the greatest drama of the century.

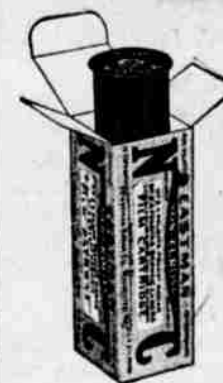
