More Settlers Than Came Last Year Anticipated This Fall.

First glimpses of the tourists that are rushing Oregonward since the colonist rates for the fall became effective September 25, reached La Grande today. Numbr 17 was made up of two sections, the second of which reached this point late this afternoon. The rates are similar in every way to those customarily put into force this time of the year, and the first consignment of middlewestern homeseekers reached this city today. Those from near-western points came through the city yesterday.

More colonists than came west last year are expected this year because crop conditions and financial affairs are better than in 1911.

mated session with a great deal of profitable results.

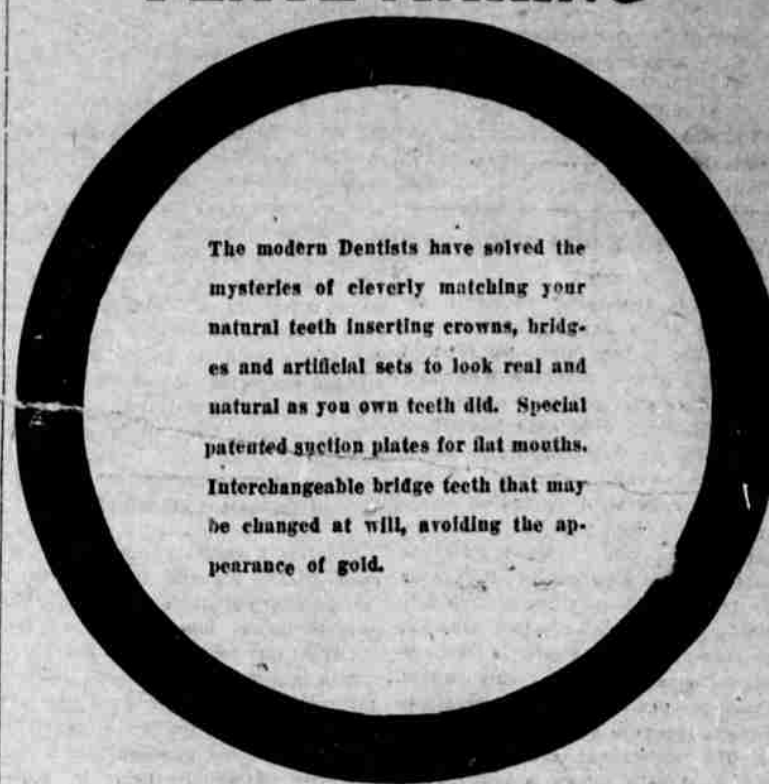
