QUEEN OF COW GIRLS IS SUED

AFTERMATH OF ROUNDUP MAY BE COSTLY.

Several Actors in Big Show Bring Suits Against "Queen."

Pendleton, Oct. 2.—(Special).—Grace Garfield Boucher and her husband, Jack Boucher, find themselves involved in a "peck of trouble" at the conclusion of the week stand of their own show, "The Cowgirl Queen." Yesterday, all of the actors and actresses commenced suit for their wages and accusing the husband the "cowgirl queen" with fraud, had him arrested and placed in jail when he failed to furnish \$300 bonds.

F. C. Fountaine, one of the actors, is the plaintiff in the suit but he holds the claims of the others, C. L. Hunt, R. Wright and wife, Zaida L. Clear, W. H. Wilcox, G. H. Hackathorn, R. C. March, Maizie Clark, Walter Mack, Jack Allen and Ethel Whalen. It is alleged in the complaint that the defendants contracted to pay the actors for their services but now refuse to do so.

An affidavit accompanying the complaint charges Jack Boucher with the practice of fraud in contracting for payment and in concealing or disposing of his properties.

He was arrested last night, placed under \$300 bonds and, upon his failure to furnish the same was sent to jail by Judge Joe H. Parks, where he still is.

Railroad for Texas Farmers.

San Antonio, Texas, Oct. 2.—What is declared to be the most extensive enterprise ever undertaken in the field of interurban railways is forecasted in the action of the stockholders of the San Antonio & Rio Grande Valley Interurban Railway company, which met today to authorize the issuance of bonds to the amount of \$10,000,000. The proceeds of the bond issue are to be used in the construction of about 250 miles of additional track that will gridiron the extreme southern part of Texas and serve as a feeder to the lines of the Frisco railroad, which is said to be back of the project. It is to be distinctly a farmers' transportation enterprise, the primary purpose being to place every tract of cultivated land in the lower Rio Grande valley and the Gulf coast region within one mile of the road. The system already has 45 miles completed and in operation.

Harrisburg, Pa., Oct. 2.—The advantages that the commission form of government offers to the smaller cities formed the principal subject of discussion at a conference here today of representatives of third-class cities and boroughs of Pennsylvania. A. M. Fuller, president of the Allied Civic Bodies, presided and delivered an address on the subject of "Efficiency in City Government." Speakers from other states explained the workings of the commission plan of government and a committee was named to draft a bill to provide for the adoption of the commission plan by Pennsylvania cities.
