OATS DUE TO TAKE A DROP

DOLLAR AND A HALF WILL NOT STAND LONG.

Much Threshed But Little Moved to Date, Say Dealers.

Immediate drop in prices for oats is predicted by those who are in close touch with affairs. Some oats have been threshed and more is being segregated from the chaff daily, but the farmers have been too busy to devote any time to moving the oats. At present the best grades of oats bring \$1.50 per hundred weight, but this price, it is said, is doomed to fall speedily. Hay, feeds and similar products are about holding their own with little action evident either in offerings or changes in prices, although the valley's products are said to be of a high grade of quality.
