PORTLAND HOG MARKET SLOW

TOP QUALITY OF SHEEP IS ALSO MISSING.

Small Run of Both Hogs and Sheep Is Report From Portland.

Portland, Oct. 3.—(Special.)—There was only a small amount of stuff available for the market at North Portland yesterday, and the same thing was true this morning. While there was a fairly good showing in the mutton division, none of the stuff was for the market. The three doubles that came forward were a direct purchase of the Union Meat company.

Conditions in the sheep trade here continue mixed. There continues a shortage of top quality and poor stuff is therefore bringing more in proportion than it is worth. Recent sales in the yards would indicate this. Since then there has been practically no change in the situation and the outlook is hopeful so far as fed stuff is concerned.

No improvement in the price of hogs is shown in North Portland. There was only a small run in the yards this morning and prices, if anything, were down a nickel from those in effect yesterday.
