Mausoleum at Pendleton.

To construct a mausoleum at Olney cemetery with a capacity of 250 tombs and containing a chapel and temporary tombs for eight bodies is the purpose of the Portland Mausoleum Co. If it can secure a deed from the city to a small tract of land within the cemetery. The proposal was made to the city council last evening through a communication from G. F. Cuthbert, manager of the company, who was here during the Round-up and who took the matter up then with the mayor and individual councilmen. Mayor Matlock last evening referred the communication to the cemetery committee of which Councilman John Dyr is chairman.

As explained in the communication, the company would construct this mausoleum without cost to the city and would thus place at the disposal of local people 250 vaults in which their dead may be interred should they prefer such form of interment to burial. The chapel would be open for use at any funeral and the receiving vault would accommodate such bodies as were not ready for permanent burial. The company proposes to turn over ten dollars from the sale of each tomb to the trustees of the cemetery to be held in a fund for the upkeep of the burial grounds.—Pendleton E.O.
