UNION FALLS BEFORE BAKER

GLADIATORS RUN UP AN ENORMOUS SCORE.

Bakerites Trimming Themselves for Boise High Saturday.

Running up the largest score ever made in a football game in this city, Baker high school was victorious in the first game of the season Friday, winning from the Union high school team by the score of 72 to 0, says a Baker paper.

While the result of the game was pleasing to the supporters of the locals, it must be said that it is not greatly to the credit of the Baker team at that, for Union was lamentably weak except in one position. Baker's attack was well developed for so early in the season, the backs, however, failing to follow their interference as they should have and the right side of the line allowed the opposing forwards through many times and permitted many plays to be broken up by their failure to make a good defense.

The game showed great possibilities, however, and Coach Nichols certainly has a bunch of material that means another championship team, barring accidents or injuries. Captain Herbert, Simons, Finley, McCulloch, Hoff, Weeks and Finch played well. Practically all the second string men were in the game after the first half and Coach Nichols had the backfield men changing about constantly.

The locals play Boise next week and will put in a hard week of preparation for the game, which will probably be the hardest one of the entire schedule.

POCATELLO IS PAYING.

Work Will Progress Rapidly Until Extreme Cold Weather.

Commencement of paving marks a new era in the building of a greater and better Pocatello, says the Pocatello Tribune.

The work that is now actively under way is pursuant to the contract recently let by the council for the laying of bitulithic after an exhaustive investigation had been made by the people of all the various pavements in use in the Pacific Northwest an investigation which resulted decisively in favor of bitulithic from every point of view. This it seems, is the invariable result where the arbiters make a selection purely upon the basis of merit, and where they can arrive at a decision in a strictly unprejudiced way.

About seven hundred tons of bitumen will be used to complete the present paving contract in Pocatello, several hundred barrels of which are already here and unloaded near the crushing plant.
