## ALUMNI AND FRIENDS HELP

### ZIMMERMAN ASSISTS CAYLOR WITH BACKFIELD.

### Tremendous Task of Teaching 11 All to Recruits, Shared.

To whip the green men and recruits into winning shape alumni and friends of the high school have started a general campaign to get assistance to Coach Caylor and Captain Bohnenkamp in the way of advice and displayed moral co-operation.

That there is so much to learn, if all be mastered, as it should be—due to the radical changes in rules and the number of new men out—has long been admitted. One of the first fruits of the help-the-team-along campaign, came when George W. Zimmerman, formerly coach of the local high, came out to assist in whipping the backfield into shape. Caylor is now working with the line and men while Zimmerman is taking charge of the backfield, drilling them in the rudiments more than in the intricate new maneuvers of 1912 football. Others who believed there is a championship in store for La Grande this year are fanning up interest and there is probably more football interest out of school than there has been for several years. The assistance under direction

of the head coach, from outside quarters is what is needed and will help. If the students know the city as a whole is interested in their showing, they will exert more diligence. Stars of recent teams not yet dwindled from vivid memory are likewise applying hammer and tongs methods in the "get the championship" boasts.

That "Shrimp" Reynolds has found his course at Rush unsatisfactory and that he is on his way to re-enter O. A. C. for his fourth and last year, is the assurance brought to J. E. Reynolds, the midget quarterback's father, today from Lee Reynolds, also a student at O. A. C. Mr. Reynolds will reach the campus tomorrow and will report for football training immediately. The announcement was made from O. A. C. yesterday and glee prevails in football circles where the presence of the veteran is anxiously awaited to assume the steering of the team. Mr. Reynolds went east a few weeks ago to look over the field with a view of entering Rush Medical but changed his mind and is returning to Oregon.
