3 LA GRANDERS ON GLEE CLUB

ITINERARY BRINGS ORGANIZATION HERE JAN. 2.
Henry Heidenrich Becomes Third Local Student on One Club.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Oct. 9.—(Special) — Henry Heidenrich of La Grande has been awarded a place on the University of Oregon Glee club this year, making a total of three singers from La Grande in that department. All three will be heard at La Grande when the club reaches there. The others are Ray Williams and Harold Grady.

Glee club contracts for this season have been closed by Manager Geary, including three with Eastern Oregon towns, which allow from ten to fifteen per cent better returns to the club than in former years. The Bungalow theatre has been secured for the Portland concert. The Glee club's program of concerts is as follows:

Astoria, December 27; Portland, December 28; Hood River, December 30; Heppner, December 31; Pendleton, January 1; La Grande, January 2; Baker, January 3; The Dalles, January 4.

SNAPSHOTS AT NOTABLES

Colonel W. C. Gorgas, Canal Zone Medical Corps.

Colonel W. C. Gorgas, to whom the gold medal offered by American Medicine has been awarded, is chief of the U. S. army medical corps in the Panama canal zone. The trustees selected Colonel Gorgas as the American physician who has performed the most conspicuous and noteworthy service in the domain of medicine in the past year.

He has earned the praise of all foreign as well as American authorities on sanitation and hygiene for the able manner in which he and his staff have rid the isthmus of Panama of the fevers and tropical diseases which killed so many thousands during the French company's lease of the canal zone.

Colonel Gorgas is a native of Alabama, the son of a Confederate general, and is fifty-eight years old. He received his literary education at the University of the South and later his medical degree from Bellevue Hospital Medical college, New York city, in 1879. After a year as interne at Bellevue he was appointed a lieutenant in the army medical corps. His advance since that time has been rapid. His rank of colonel was voted to him by special act of congress in 1903 for yellow fever work at Havana. Colonel Gorgas' title in the army medical organization is that of assistant surgeon general.

What Roosevelt Did as President

What did Roosevelt do as president? Every day we are requested to print something of his record of achievements. Roosevelt accomplished more real constructive work as president than any other man who ever was in the white house. But his greatest work was his leadership of the nation to new moral standards in business and in public life.

Some of the more notable achievements of President Roosevelt in opposition to the combined forces of big crooked business and crooked politics are:

- Dolliver-Hepburn railroad act.
- Extension of forest reserve.
- National Irrigation act.
- Improvement of waterways and reservation of water power sites.
- Employers' liability act.
- Safety appliance act.
- Regulation of railroad employes' hours of labor.
- Establishment of bureau of corporations.
- Pure food and drugs act.
- Federal meat inspection.
- Settlement of the coal strike in 1902.
- The government upheld in Northern Securities decision.
- Conviction of postoffice grafters and public land thieves.
- Directed investigation of the sugar trust customs frauds, and the resultant prosecution.
- Suits begun against the Standard Oil and Tobacco companies and other corporations for violation of the Sherman anti-trust act.
- Corporations forbidden to contribute to political campaign funds.
- Inauguration of movement for conservation of natural resources.
- Inauguration of movement for improvement of conditions of country life.

The Panama policy and action which made possible the most colossal work of all time.

During his term in the white house President Roosevelt was the most conspicuous friend of peace in the civilized world, and won the Nobel peace prize. Among his achievements in that line were:

- Second intervention in Cuba to establish peace.
- Alaska boundary dispute settled.
- China saved from partition and policy of open door established.
- Twenty-four treaties of general arbitration negotiated.
- Negotiations opened by which Russo-Japanese war was ended.
- Avoidance of bad feeling with Japan over exclusion policy.
- Among the policies urged by President Roosevelt, to whose leadership the public sentiment in these matters is largely due, are:
- Reform of the banking and currency system.
- Inheritance tax.
- Income tax.
- Passage of a new employers' liability act to meet objections raised by the supreme court.
- Postal savings banks.
- Parcels post.
- Revision of the Sherman anti-trust act.
- Legislation to prevent over-capitalization, stock watering, etc., of common carriers.
- Legislation compelling incorporation under federal laws of corporations engaged in interstate commerce.
