### California Really Congress.

Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 10.—Nearly 500 delegates, representing the realty boards of practically every important city in the state, gathered in Los Angeles today for the annual convention of the California State Realty Federation. The sessions will last three days and will be devoted to the consideration of taxation, publicity methods and needed legislation. Mabry McMahon of San Francisco is the president of the federation and the presiding officer of the convention. The federation proposes to undertake a vigorous campaign to protect the investing public from fraudulent and dishonest real estate promoters and dealers.

### Anniversary of Cuban Revolution.

Havana, Oct. 10.—This being the 34th anniversary of the beginning of the ten years' war (1895-78) for Cuban independence, the day was observed as a general holiday. Business in Havana was largely suspended and all public and many private buildings were decorated in honor of the occasion. On the whole, however, the celebration was not attended with much enthusiasm as usual, owing probably to the present disturbed condition of the country and the uncertainty over the result of the approaching presidential election.

### LA GRANDE VISITORS WERE NOT AUTHORIZED

President Taft Do's Not Indorse the Work of Harlan and Bede Who Spoke Here.

It will be remembered that when Theodore Roosevelt was here during the fair a special train conveying Harlan and Bede followed and these gentlemen talked on the street following Roosevelt's speech. The matter was dropped there until the last few days when President Taft has taken the matter up and had Mr. Hilles, his campaign manager, issue the following letter:

To Theodore Roosevelt:

President Taft has instructed me to inform you that under no circumstances will he allow those who campaign in his behalf to indulge in false accusation concerning your personal morals, temperance or probity. He begs me to say that he has telegraphed today to J. Adam Bede and John Marshall Harlan, the short-weight son of the late lamented and honored justice of the supreme court, to cease their campaign of abuse on the stump. Further than this he desires at this late date, but in some fitting manner, to acknowledge that your statement in regard to accepting another term was made by you only when it was necessary on that occasion to insure Mr. Taft's nomination in 1905. The president believes that he has been ill-advised during his administration by Crane, Guggenheim, Aldrich, Cannon and Barnes, and that there can be no hope of his success unless he takes the reins in his hands and acts according to his own natural, honorable inclinations.
