The Portland market for peaches is overburdened with offerings and sales are again being made down to 35c a box, although best fruit is still nominally quoted as high as 50c, says a Portland paper.

Receipts of clings are greatly increased, shipments coming from all directions except extreme Southern Oregon. The latter section is shipping to California, owing to the glut here.

There is quite a firm tone for pears, with receipts very light at the present time. Best offerings are quoted strong at \$1.50 a box this morning with not enough to supply the demand at this figure.

Strawberries continue to come forward in fair supply. There is some very good stock showing, and this is selling at high as \$3.75 a crate while
