Critical Markets Will Be Anxious to Pick up Select Grades.

"Those in closest touch with the apple market have looked in vain for any signs of an improved demand or price," says a market expert, writing in a Portland paper. He continues: "Everywhere there are heavy crops and business in general is not good enough to absorb these increased offerings without making some concession in previous year's values."

"There is no doubt that extra fancy apples will continue to sell at high prices but as only a small per cent of the bumper crop of the country is of this grade, it stands to reason that the price of extra fancy cuts practically no consideration in the trade, in fact reflects nothing so far as what other stock should be selling at."

"With only a very limited crop of apples that will grade extra fancy this season, there is no doubt that the world's trade will gladly pick these up and pay a material premium for them over what would be offered for ordinary to fancy goods."
