TIMELY HINTS FOR FARMERS

Grading Up the Dairy Herd.
Systematic grading up of our common stock with a pure bred male from large producing ancestry will result in a highly profitable dairy herd in five to seven years, says the Kansas Farmer. The greatest improvement should result in the first cross, and we are confident the right kind of sire will increase the milk yield of first generation 50 per cent over the yield of the best common cows. The percentage named is conservative. We have seen in stances in which the increase was 100 per cent in the heifer's first milking. This, of course, is unusual, but a 50 per cent increase should not prove in the least disappointing. By the use of the right kind of sires the milk and butter fat yield of each succeeding generation can be increased with absolute certainty.
