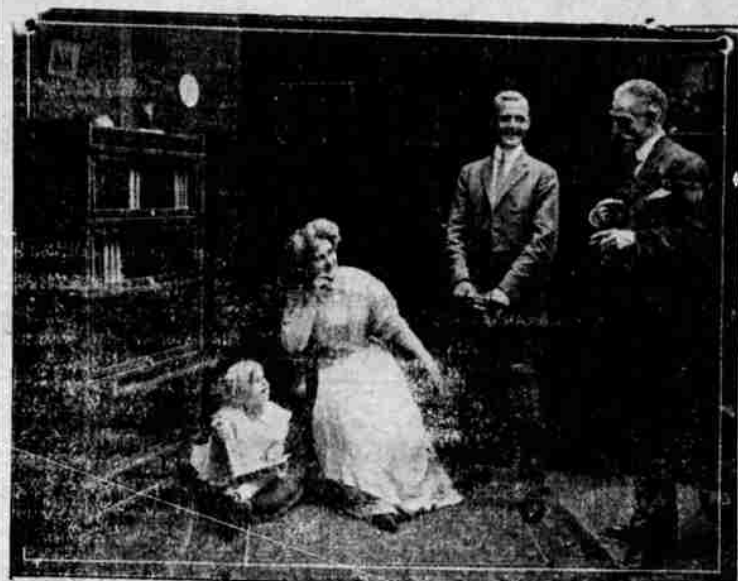


What Does Baby Say?
