HOME PRODUCTION NOT ENOUGH
FOR LOCAL USE.

Meat Dealers Believe Sister Counties
Must Again Help.

That sister counties and sister states will again be called upon to assist in filling the demand for Thanksgiving turkeys is the belief of local meat dealers. While little attention has been given the turkey market at this time, meat handlers feel that it is scarcely possible for Union county poultry raisers to have increased their flocks so extensively that the home market will be sufficient. Wallowa county and Weiser were called upon last year; hence the moral remains vivid that the turkey industry should be followed with more attention here. When there is insufficient attention to supply the home market the business must necessarily be a sure money maker for the farmer and poultrymen.
