

JOE REYNOLDS WINS CONTEST

FLY-KILLING CAMPAIGN IS ENDED
THIS MORNING.

Total of Nearly Twelve Million Flies
Slain During the Period.

Joe Reynolds wins the sweepstakes prize of \$5.00 cash hung up by the mayor and councilmen for the greatest killing of the flies during the Y. M. C. A. boys' campaign against flies lasting a month or more. Young Reynolds alone slew over 5,000,000 while the grand total for the period was 12,178,952—and still there are flies left.

The contest ended this morning and the four leading winners were photographed as the mighty ones in the fly-killing campaign. The scheme has worked out well and Secretary J. H. Rudd is well satisfied with the showing. Not alone will the loss of about 12,000,000 flies reduce the menace of the disease spreader to that extent but the sport has been enjoyed by the contestants.
