"FERGIE" FERGUSON DEAD.

Old-Time Bartender at Pendleton,
Well Known Here, Passes Away.

Many La Grande people will be interested in knowing that E. R. Ferguson of Pendleton is dead. He had many friends here and this is what the Pendleton East Oregonian says of the incident:

E. R. Ferguson, Pendleton bartender, for many years and popularly known as "Fergie," died yesterday afternoon at the state hospital for the insane at Salem, according to a message received last night by George Darveau from Superintendent R. E. L. Steiner. He was committed to that institution two weeks ago after an attack of apoplexy had left him mentally enfeebled. The body is being held at Salem until some word is received from relatives of the deceased who live in Roanoke, Virginia.

"Fergie" was probably the best known bartender in the inland empire. He had been in Pendleton for more than ten years, having served drinks in the barrooms of the Hotel Pendleton, Hotel St. George and other places and at one time having run a saloon of his own. His peculiar impediment of speech, his originality and his extraordinary sharpness of wit, made him popular with all patrons of drink emporiums and he was known all through the Western states.

Several months ago while at work in the St. George bar, he suffered a stroke of apoplexy, and though he partially recovered, his mind was impaired by it and physicians announced that death was only a matter of weeks. Two weeks ago he became so irrational and helpless that it was considered best to send him to the state asylum.

He was about 57 years of age at the time of his death and had no relatives in this part of the country. A brother living in Roanoke, Va., was apprised of his condition some time ago and a message announcing his death was dispatched today.

Noted Soldier 85 Years Old.

London, Oct. 16.—The observance a week or so ago of the 85th birthday of Lord Roberts served to call attention today to the 85th birthday of another noted British soldier, General Sir William Gordon Cameron. General Cameron began his military career nearly seventy years ago and took part in almost every important war an military expedition in which British arms has been engaged from the Crimean war in the '50s until his retirement from the service in 1895.
