Lively Politics in Pennsylvania.

Philadelphia, Pa., Oct. 16.—The liveliest week of the presidential campaign in Pennsylvania is at hand. The Progressives will start the ball rolling tomorrow with the entrance of Governor Johnson of California into the state. The Governor is to begin his tour at Easton, and will reach Wilkesbarre and the coal regions later in the day. He will be heard at the Academy of Music in this city Friday and the following night he will close the week with a speech at Pittsburgh. Colonel Roosevelt is scheduled to invade Philadelphia next Monday, and will probably spend three days in Pennsylvania. He will be closely followed by the Republican speakers, John M. Harlan and J. Adam Bode, who will appear in this city next Tuesday, the day following Colonel Roosevelt's visit, and will deliver several speeches under the auspices of the Republican Congressional Committee.

ary bishop of Japan last June by the Church of England in Canada, was consecrated in Christ church-Cathedral today with imposing ceremonies. The cathedral was filled to its capacity with church dignitaries who are now in the city in attendance on the session of the Provincial Synod. The Archbishop of Ottawa officiated and among the other participants were the Bishops of Huron, Algoma, Niagara, Ontario and Montreal.
