MAHAFFEY IS CONFIDENT.

Conflicting Reports out About Reasons For Getting on Ticket.

Portland, Oregon, October 19. (Special)—The many friends of E. P. (Pat) Mahaffey, independent candidate for the office of railroad commissioner from the second district have been greatly worried of late because of the conflicting newspaper reports, some stating that Secretary of State Olcott had refused to place the name of Mr. Mahaffey upon the ballot. Under the election law, it is necessary to file with the district clerk representatives in the district and this was done by Mr. Mahaffey. There is no question but that his name will appear upon the ballot in every county as nomination certificates have been sent to and acknowledged by all clerks.

Mr. Mahaffey returned yesterday from an extended campaign trip through Eastern Oregon and is confident of carrying this section of the state by a safe majority November 5th. "The people of Eastern Oregon realize that my platform is progressive and takes into consideration the wants of their section of the country," said Mr. Mahaffey in speaking of his trip. "The operation of sub-trains when the regular is over three hours behind schedule posting of time tables stating authentically time of arrival of delayed trains, minimum rate of speed of 15 miles per hour for live stock trains—these are issues which vitally affect the future welfare of Eastern Oregon. The fact that I advocate these measures and also that I am the only aspirant for this office who has had active railroad experience is also counting heavily in my favor."

Mr. Mahaffey left last night for Clatsop and Columbia counties where he will campaign for a few days, returning then to Portland and spending the remainder of the campaign in and about this city.
