WILL TELL OF LIFE ON FARM

UNION SERVICES WILL BE HELD IN BAPTIST CHURCH.

E. R. Martin Brings Message of Unusual Interest to all.

An unusually important and interesting public gathering will be held in the First Baptist church of La Grande Sunday evening, October 27, when the Baptist, Christian, Methodist Episcopal, Methodist Episcopal South, and Lutheran congregations will call off the usual evening service to hear E. R. Martin of Portland discuss the religious and social conditions of the rural districts of Oregon and the country at large as based upon the findings of the Roosevelt Country Life Commission, the National Country Life Congress and various other nation wide surveys. In an address appropriately entitled "The Challenge of the Farm".

Mr. Martin has for more than 14 years been associated with the oldest Home Missionary society in America, the American Sunday School Union through the Mississippi Valley states and on the coast and is now in charge of the work of that society in the states of Oregon, Idaho, and Washington. His address, however, is "something different" than the usual addresses of Sunday school workers and is spoken of as both startling and interesting to every student of modern political and social conditions. As Mr. Martin says, he has "a message to the man interested in keeping down taxation that is well worth most careful consideration."
