BETTER FORM WINS CONTEST

WEAKENED LINE WORKS WITH UNISON.

Costly Fumbling Prevents La Grande From Scoring in First Half.

Whipped into Thanksgiving form and snap by a fumbled punt that netted Union a touchdown and a kicked goal in the first half of the game with Union Saturday, Coach Caylor's student retriever last honors by winning 22 to 7. Listlessness and discouraging fumbling cost the blue and white three touchdowns and would have been even more costly but for Garrity's ability to follow the ball and recover. It was not until the second half that La Grande developed the finishing "punch." The visitors played the home team to a standstill in the first quarter through the magnificent defense of Hess, Davis, Goodbrod and Harn, and the offensive skill of the last two. Goodbrod gained ground every time he took the spheroid.

It was late in the second period, when, after see-saws in the center of the field, both teams lacking the necessary ounce to put a runner over that Goodbrod sent a low swift ugly punt to Geddes on the four yard line and it mystified the safety. Though noted for his cool head in the pinches Geddes like the Clark of old, "forgot" and converted a normal touchback to a touchdown, when a Union end pounced on the ball.

The fluke and the kicked goal were Unions only scores. However, Geddes was not alone in "forgetting" for a Union player made a safety out of a touchback by careless playing.

The score whipped La Grande into form and she immediately started a long march to Union's 15 yard line when the half ended.

The second half developed some good football, too, in which Snider in tackle around plays was a veritable Heaton, running with a vicious churning stride that bowled tacklers over at every charge. La Grande ran the ball the length of the field five times without scoring, Union holding on her 10-yard line once, the half stopping another, and three fumbles doing the rest. Geddes shot a mystifying mixture of cross bucks, end runs, tackles around and forward passes at Union that gave Kiddle, Hunter, Snider, Bohnenkamp, Ralston and Leffel chances to shine. Picking holes like veterans, Kiddle, Hunter and Carroll who replaced Kiddle late in the game, reeled off 10, 15 and even 30 yard dashes and Ralston, who has developed wonderfully as a line plunger, had the "punch" to put the ball over. Union got off one splendid forward pass to Davis, and La Grande got one off, the best sample this year, when Leffel, coming at an angle, took the pass on the dead run in fine form. Bohnenkamp unraveled the longest run of the day on a delayed fake forward pass.

La Grande showed her line to be 1,000 per cent better than a week ago. Conkey has been shifted to guard and though light, leads the center crowd in breaking through and tackling sure and fiercely—though Winters and Huff are breaking through as often they less often nail the man in his tracks. The forward wall is now a safe one in any game, it seems.
