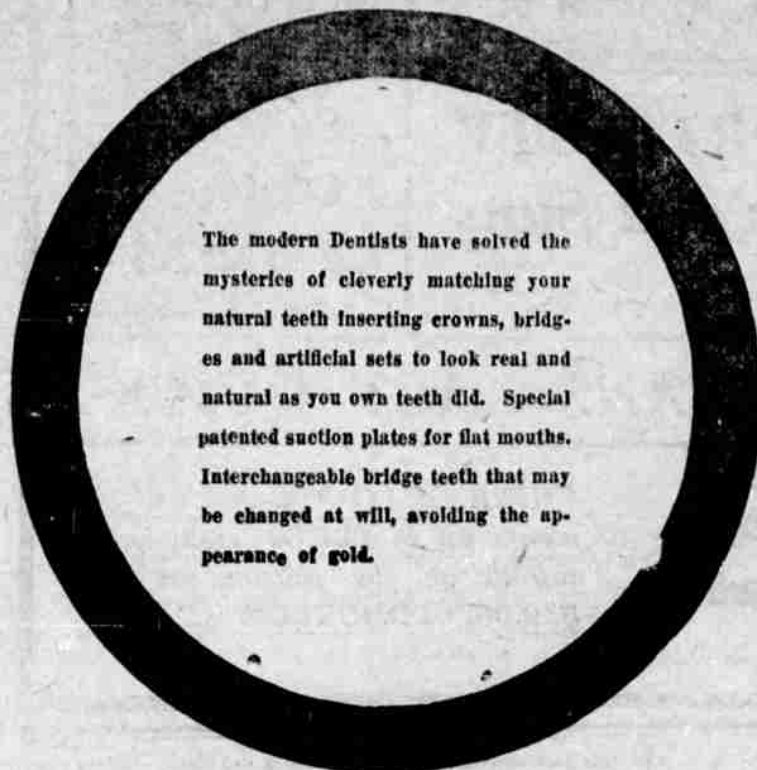

THE IMBLER-ALICEL FRUIT DISTRICT

Where the Grande Ronde Apples Grow—A Series of Articles Describing One of Eastern Oregon's Greatest Resources.

ARTICLE NO. 9.

When concerns with a reputation for square dealing; concerns that value that reputation more than they do their bank accounts, take hold of the fruit land development in a fruit section it is a safe bet there is value and merit to the enterprise.

This statement applies to such concerns as the La Grande Investment company and the Wenaha Lumber company, each of which is interested in a very large way in the Imbler-Alicel district.

The La Grande Investment company, composed of J. K. Wright and W. B. Sargent, has long been one of La Grande's substantial business concerns. They handle other people's money as well as their own, which fact alone is convincing of the reliability of the concern.

This company purchased the C. C. Pennington ranch a few years ago. It consisted of 360 acres where Mr. Pennington grew rich raising wheat and retired. This was about the time the pioneer was wavering in his judgment about the Sandridge land producing fruit. Had it been a year later it is doubtful if the investment company would have been able to buy for by that time all doubt had been dispelled and land jumped several paces in price.

But the company purchased the big wheat ranch and instead of planting a few acres to try it out on fruit they showed confidence in the business and planted the whole tract to fruit. Yes, it is a big orchard but it is a good one and this year there was nothing in the Northwest that looked any better. The trees have excellent

growth, they are well cared for and not a thing is omitted to make it the model orchard of the district. However, nearly every fruit grower has that same "model orchard" idea in his head and to all appearances the entire Imbler-Alicel district is to be one great model orchard in a very short time.

The La Grande Investment company while not pushing the sale of orchard tracts until development is further made, has nevertheless sold a number. Several of the customers who live at a distance have been here this season to look at their lands and in every instance there was that satisfaction which sends the reputation of Grande Ronde orchards across the continent. People who had bought one tract were pleased to the extent of contracting for more. This is not a bad recommendation for the enterprise, and coupled with this sort of recommendation comes the words of praise from agricultural college representatives sent to view the investment company's holdings.

When the Sandridge comes into its own as it will, the La Grande Investment company will have the credit for the first concern that was willing to go 360 acres strong on the orchards before the district was a positively proven commercial fruit district.

The Wenaha Lumber company has 120 acres developed to three year old trees, and like old Peter Westonskow, they considered the Winter Banana an apple of extreme merit so they planted it largely through their tract. The ever present potato, which is an adjunct to all orchard land in the district, has thrived beyond belief in the

Wenaha holdings this year. In harvesting the potato crop long rows of sacks filled with spuds were to be seen and in hauling off the potatoes many teams were used. The average yield in potatoes this year was 125 sacks to the acre.

The Wenaha company is putting their holdings on the market in small tracts with ready sale. It is hardly believable that land planted to Winter Banana apples can be bought for the staple prevailing price in the district, but like all of the other companies, the Wenaha folks have kept the faith and refused to raise the prices on their land.

Hibberd and Thronson also have a splendid tract set to apple trees now three years old. This is considered one of the best holdings in the valley although not the largest by any means. One man who acquired the "pear

habit" was Dr. Lilly of Cove. The doctor had studied the pear with great care and he determined to try it out in the Imbler-Alicel district. He broke the record by planting 40 acres to the choicest varieties known to the fruit world and then he settled down to caring for them and watching them grow. His effort has been rewarded in a way pleasing to him for it is doubtful if there is a pear orchard in Oregon that has better appearance today.
