THE IMBLER-ALICEL FRUIT DISTRICT

Where the Grande Ronde Apples Grow—A Series of Articles Describing One of Eastern Oregon's Greatest Resources.

ARTICLE NO. 10.

To close the general remarks on the fruit district without calling attention to one of the most prominent figures would not be the proper thing and for that reason we direct the attention of the reader to one George L. Cleaver—the man who raises apples for an occupation and runs for Congress on the Prohibition ticket as a pastime.

Mr. Cleaver is associated with some of the largest business institutions of the valley. One day he had a hunch—he says those hunches come to him occasionally. This was not a political hunch, but just a plain business hunch that told him there was money in the Imbler-Alicel country for him. He dabbled a little just as every good business man does when trying on a new idea. But his dabbling grew stronger and he began to read about fruit, all the time condemning fruit juices after they had fermented.

He bumped up against Burbank and a few more of the tried and true fruit men, with the result that he took on a little inside argument with himself regarding the Sandridge. After fighting the battle through, looking at the proposition from all angles he quit La Grande, moved to Imbler, acquired the title of mayor among his friends and finally developed into the Big Bull Moose of the Imbler country. These few remarks have nothing to do in particular with the general

fruit outlook there, except that when George Cleaver is converted to a business enterprise there is every reason to believe that there is some money to be made, and that too without too much physical exertion.

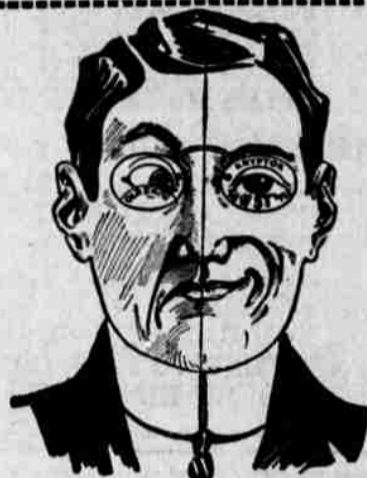
