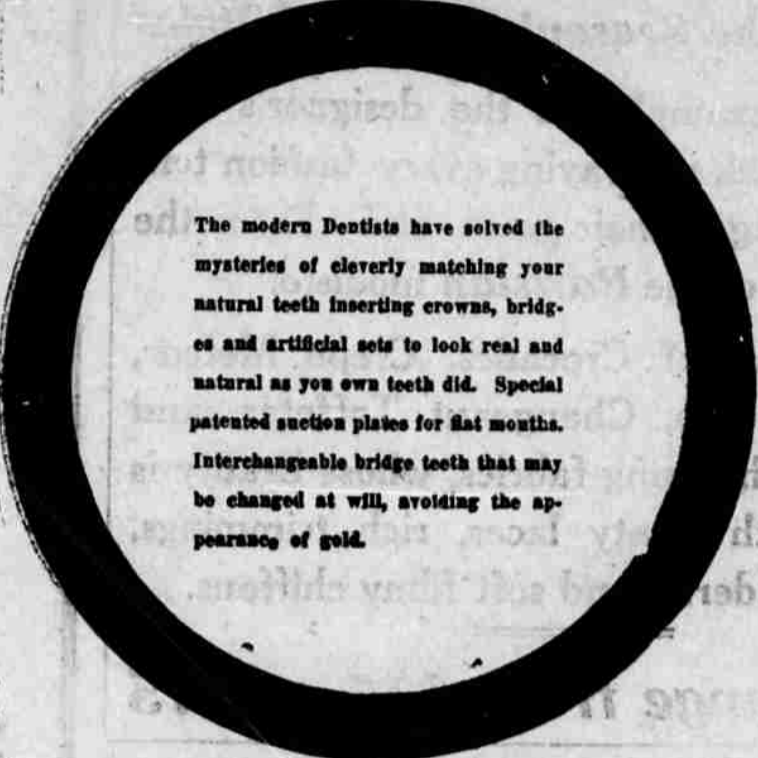

The lucky number goes to the maidenly companion (Miss Lizzie) of Mrs. "Foxy" Peyton meantime all the friends of Jack and Helene knowing their fondness for each other, have been turning heaven and earth to purchase as many coupons as possible. The complications which follow are said to be most amusing and novel.

The third act is given up to the efforts of the friends of Jack to recover the lucky number from Lizzie, which they finally succeed in doing, thus bringing happiness to the star reporter and his newly found sweetheart.
