LIGHTER HOGS DROP AND HEAVY-IES RISE.

Seven Cents is Now Price for Both Types of Porkers in the County

Stiffer demands for heavy hogs has pushed the quotation for that variety of pork up half a cent placing the prices for heavy hogs on a par with lighter hogs—usually a shade the better price bringers. Light hogs dropped a quarter of a cent at the same time, as the market has been flooded locally with that variety of porkers.

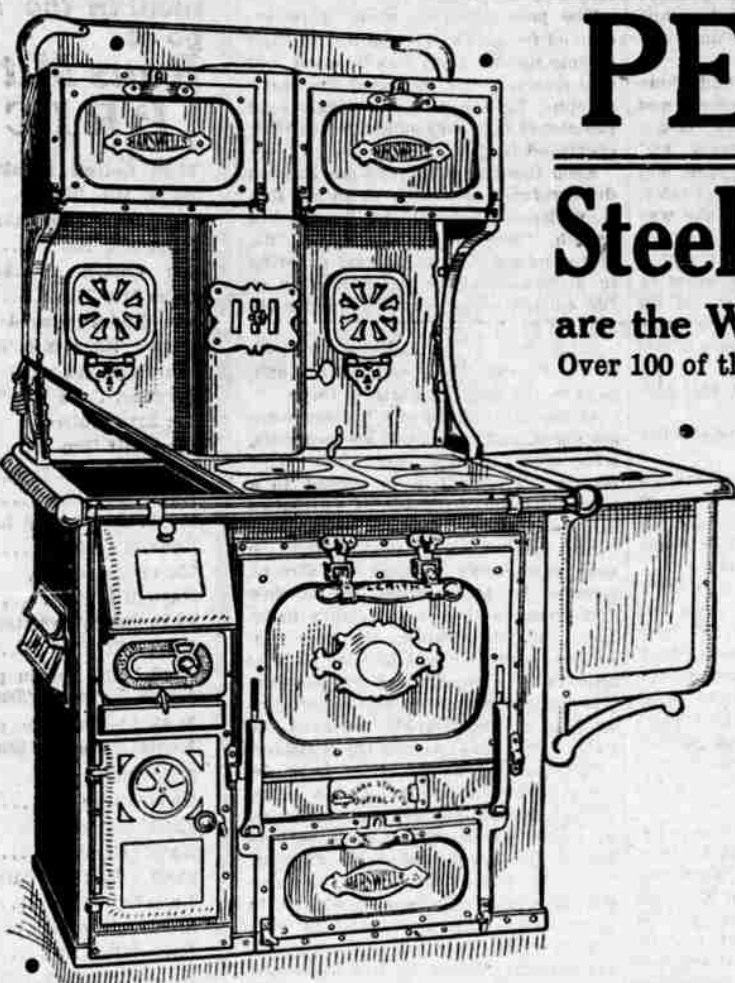
