### EARLY RETURNS OF ELECTION

OBSERVER REPORTS PRINTED IN MORNING EDITION.

Revised Up-to-Date for the Readers of This Paper.

Following are the early morning reports and bulletins published in our early morning edition, revised and printed for those who did not receive our 5 o'clock paper:

**New York, Nov. 6.**—Theodore Roosevelt said tonight in answer to the announcement that Wilson had been elected president: "The American people by a great plurality have conferred upon you the highest honor in their gift. I congratulate you there on. Signed, Theodore Roosevelt."

**New York, Nov. 6.**—Congressman Sulzer is elected governor of New York. In 29 states at 1 o'clock this morning six states have decided finally on governors as follows: Foss in Massachusetts, Baldwin in Connecticut; Dunne, Democratic, in Illinois, and Colquitt, Democratic, in Texas, Major in Missouri.

#### What Wilson Carried.

Returns this morning indicate that unless doubtful is appended to the state, Wilson has carried the following with the electoral college vote as given:

Alabama 12, Arizona 3, Arkansas 9, Colorado 6, Connecticut 7, Florida 6, Georgia 14, Indiana 15 (doubtful), Kentucky 13, Louisiana 10, Maryland 8, Massachusetts 18, Mississippi 10, Missouri 18, New Jersey 14, New Mexico 3, New York 45, North Carolina 12, Ohio 24, South Carolina 9, Texas 20, Virginia 12, Wisconsin 13 (doubtful), Delaware 3, Pennsylvania (doubtful with Roosevelt 38), Rhode Island 5. Total electoral votes practically assured Wilson, 347. Necessary to elect, 266.

Since these totals were struck Nebraska has gone to Wilson adding 8 votes to him.

#### Utah for Taft.

Taft has carried Utah with four votes.

#### Roosevelt States.

Idaho is probably for Roosevelt, 4; Vermont 4; probably Illinois with 29; perhaps Michigan with 15, North and South Dakota with a total of 10; New Hampshire with four and a chance for Pennsylvania with 38. Total for Roosevelt with about 50 of these college votes in great doubt, is 122.

Washington is certain late this morning with 7 and California more doubtful.

For the benefit of the readers who

were not present when the early evening returns came over the wires to the Observer headquarters, these bulletins are listed below in the order named:

**Bulletin No. 3.**—The Associated Press says returns from 1287 districts out of 3093 in the state outside of New York City: Taft 144,833; Wilson 159,160; Roosevelt 10,000.

The Atlanta Constitution says Wilson's plurality in Georgia is 35,000 at least.

Indiana: 73 precincts out of 3172 Wilson, 11,050; Taft 7588; Roosevelt 6051.

**Bulletin No. 4.**—Jefferson City, Mo., Nov. 6.—Returns from Cole county indicate that pluralities will be as follows: Wilson 300; Majority for Democrats 300; Congressman Shackelford, Democratic, Eighth district, 350.

Chicago.—For governor 29 precincts out of 2788 precincts outside of Cook county give Dunne, Democratic 2554; Deneen, Republican, 2060; Funk, Progressive 3403.

Milwaukee.—Four precincts in Crown county give Wilson 449; Taft 259; Roosevelt 131.

Indianapolis.—56 precincts out of 3172 in Indiana give Governor Ralston Democratic 5634; Beveridge, Progressive, 5579; Durbin, Republican, 4420. The same precincts in 1908 gave Wilson, Republican, 11,648; Marshall, Democratic, 11,527.

Philadelphia.—The North American says Roosevelt has carried Pennsylvania.

St. Paul.—Returns from Minnesota will be very late. Polls did not close until nine o'clock.

Chicago, Nov. 6.—Forty-seven precincts out of 2788 outside of Cook county give Deneen 3359, Dunne 4374 Funk 4934.

Springfield, Mo.—Eight out of 24 precincts in Green county give Wilson 963; Taft 1171; Roosevelt 510; for governor Major, Democratic, 610; McKinley, Republican, 784.

Detroit, Mich.—Forty-seven out of 177 precincts in Detroit: Taft 3007; Wilson 2358; Roosevelt 1621.

Indianapolis.—Twenty-seven precincts out of 3172 in the state give Taft 2038; Wilson 3987; Roosevelt 2314.

Washington.—104 precincts out of 1903 in the state: Taft 4415, Wilson 5177, Roosevelt 7816.

The progressive state chairman is claiming Washington state for Roosevelt by 45,000.

**Bulletin No. 6.**—South Dakota.—MacPherson county Wilson 400, Roosevelt 600. It is estimated that in Minnehaha county Wilson receives 2700, Roosevelt 3300. Estimated returns from 402 precincts out of 1653 in South Dakota give Roosevelt a plurality of 2283.

Newark, N. J.—Democratic headquarters claim that Wilson carried the state. Ten of the twelve congressmen are Democrats and there will be a Democratic majority in the joint ballot in the legislature making it certain that a Democratic senator will be chosen.

**Bulletin No. 7.**—Wisconsin: North Milwaukee: For governor Karel Dem. 173, McGovern, Rep., 110. In 1910 Schmitz 84, McGovern 147.

Milwaukee.—Fourteen precincts in Grant county give Wilson 924; Taft

869; Roosevelt 151.

Boston.—Returns for governor from 461 out of 1102 voting precincts in Massachusetts give Bird, Progressive 41,492, Foss Democratic, 78,382, Walker, Republican, 48,948.

Brooklyn.—The Eagle says that Congressman Calder, Republican, is re-elected in the Sixth district by over 3,000.

Hartford.—Kennedy, Democratic probably elected for congress in the fifth district.

**Bulletin No. 8.**—Cripple Creek.—No straight ballots are counted. The Democrats carried the county.

Omaha.—Eighteen precincts in Nebraska outside of Omaha: Taft 1019, Wilson 1666, Roosevelt 845, Debs 130. Des Moines, Ia.—Early returns in scattered precincts show that Taft is polling one-third of the vote of 1908. Illinois.—For governor—One hundred eight precincts of 278 in Illinois outside of Cook county: Dunne 9630, Funk 8900, Deneen 7094.

Grand Rapids.—Ten out of 41 precincts in the city: Roosevelt 2300, Wilson 1400, Taft 1200.

Seattle.—When the city polls closed there were many voters in the polling places. All were permitted to vote.

Des Moines.—Twenty-five scattered precincts in the state: Taft 1368, Wilson 1591, Roosevelt 2161.

Grand Rapids.—Ten out of 41 precincts show: Roosevelt 2300, Wilson 1400, Taft 1200.

South Dakota.—It is estimated that 608 precincts out of 1653 show Roosevelt leading Wilson by 3133.

Philadelphia.—One hundred ninety-seven districts out of 5859 in Pennsylvania: Taft 11,087, Wilson 58,227, Roosevelt 8,183.

San Francisco.—Harry Seemansky estimates that Wilson has carried San Francisco by 20,000 plurality.

New York.—Six towns out of 38 cities and towns: Taft 965, Roosevelt 179, Wilson 415.

Los Angeles.—First city precincts give Roosevelt 82, Wilson 68, Debs 56 and Taft 4.

San Francisco.—Three scattered precincts in San Francisco give Wilson 10, Roosevelt 7.

San Antonio.—Partial returns from 18 precincts in Texas out of a total of 4125 give Wilson 731, Taft 137, Roosevelt 180, Debs 28.

Denver.—The polls closed in Colorado at 7 p. m. In the last two hours the voting in all precincts in Denver was unusually heavy, the balloting passing quickly. State scratching was heavy, indicating a slow count.

Hartford, Conn.—Forty-nine towns give Wilson 47,346, Taft 49,543, Roosevelt 21,500.

Omaha, Neb.—Forty-eight precincts in the fourth ward give Taft 60, Roosevelt 44, Wilson 167.

South Omaha.—The first precinct, Third ward: Taft 73, Roosevelt 44, Wilson 71.

Brenham, Tex.—Wilson 390, Roosevelt 14, Taft 35, Debs 72.

Portland, Me.—One hundred sixty out of 6246 cities and town in Vermont give Roosevelt 16,148, Taft 16,508, Wilson 11,169.

**Bulletin No. 7.**—Arizona.—The count is slow. No returns as yet. The full vote was cast.

Los Angeles.—The first city precincts give Roosevelt 82, Wilson 68

Debs 56, Taft 4.

White River Junction, Ver.—Returns collected by the Republican state committee show the result in 11 counties out of 14 in Vermont: Roosevelt 17,671, Taft 10,045, Wilson 12,774.

Cincinnati.—Thirty precincts in Ohio give Taft 1721, Wilson 2328, Roosevelt 1057.

Cincinnati.—One hundred twenty-six precincts in city of Cincinnati: Taft 1039, Wilson 489, Roosevelt 152.

Louisville.—Counts complete: Wilson 29,946, Taft 11,827, Roosevelt 9,371.

New York.—Wilson carried Delaware and also Connecticut.

East St. Louis, Ills.—Twenty-eight precincts out of 40: Wilson 3346; Taft 1786, Roosevelt 846.

Los Angeles.—The first five precincts complete, in Los Angeles city: Roosevelt 314, Wilson 238, Debs 33 Taft 11.

**Bulletin No. 9.**—Fresno.—Partial returns from 21 Fresno city precincts give Wilson 64, Roosevelt 461.

St. Louis.—One hundred thirty precincts out of 286 in Missouri outside of St. Louis give Wilson 14,643, Taft 6,406, Roosevelt 6369.

Idaho.—Seven precincts of 64 in the state give Taft 411, Wilson 288, Roosevelt 3264.

Wash.—Fifteen precincts out of 577 give Taft 2691, Wilson 2073, Roosevelt 2160.

Los Angeles.—Three hundred ten precincts give Roosevelt 10,333, Wilson 7,380, Taft 280, Debs 2455.

Arizona.—Wilson 533, Roosevelt 352 Taft 323.

San Diego, Cal.—Ten precincts complete give Wilson 124, Roosevelt 108, Taft 6.

Sacramento.—Six precincts incomplete give Wilson 92, Roosevelt 60.

Oakland.—Eight precincts incomplete give Roosevelt 3061, Wilson 239, Medford, Ore.—Scattering returns in six precincts: Wilson 21, Roosevelt 23, Taft 11, Bourne 20, Clark 3, Lane 16, Selling 23.

Seattle.—Thirty-seven precincts in this city give Roosevelt 3,000, Wilson 2560, Taft 2022.

Philadelphia.—Five hundred twenty-five districts out of 1216 in Philadelphia: Taft 25,652, Roosevelt 15,404, Wilson 14,532.

Albuquerque, N. M.—The total registered vote in New Mexico is 80,000. No figure available in the state results. A light vote is reported, with Republicans claiming a majority.

Tucson, Ariz.—Complete returns give Wilson 633, Roosevelt 553, Taft 329, Debs 63, Chaffin 10.

**Bulletin No. 20.**—Bisbee, Ariz.—Partial vote shows: Wilson 150, Roosevelt 133, Taft 31, Debs 117, Chaffin 4.

New York.—The Associated Press says Wilson has carried Massachusetts, Maine, Connecticut, New York, Maryland, New Jersey and the Southern state.

Dallas, Texas.—Nine hundred sixty precincts out of 4108 in Texas: Wilson 9650, Taft 830, Roosevelt 730.

**Bulletin No. 22.**—Scattering returns from over South Dakota indicate Roosevelt has carried the state by not less than 5,000. The governorship is very close, with

Johnson, Democratic, slightly in the lead.

Louisville.—Wilson will have about 88,000 majority in Kentucky.

The New York Sun says that for the first time on record the Democrats come down the Harlem river with a majority.

New York City.—Seventeen hundred districts out of 1730: Wilson 306,362, Roosevelt 185,172.

**Bulletin No. 23.**—San Francisco.—Twenty complete city precincts give Wilson 828, Roosevelt 717.

San Diego, Cal.—Twenty-one precincts out of 147 in San Diego county give Wilson 630, Roosevelt 501, Taft 7.

Fallon, Nev.—Partial returns from two precincts in Churchill county give Roosevelt 21, Wilson 31, Taft 16, Debs 16.

**Bulletin No. 27.**—Denver, Colo.—Basis represented from 101 precincts indicate Wilson should get 120,000, Roosevelt 75,000 Taft 78,000.

Indianapolis.—Wilson's plurality over Taft in Indiana is estimated at 133,000.

Susanville, Cal.—Five precincts in Lassen county: Roosevelt 110, Wilson 171, Taft 13, Debs 25.

New York.—The Associated Press says 1678 city districts out of 1734 are: Sulzer, Democratic, 293,8000, Strauss 187,643, Hedges, Republican 108,738.

Los Angeles.—Four hundred two city precincts give Roosevelt 30,890, Wilson 24,548, Debs 8,068, Taft 1063.

**Bulletin No. 29.**—Providence.—Rhode Island conceded to Wilson.

San Francisco.—One hundred precincts: Wilson 11,793, Roosevelt 9,616, Debs 3,218.

Los Angeles.—Reports from Phoenix indicate that Wilson carried all counties in Arizona.

**Bulletin No. 30.**—Washington.—One hundred four precincts out of 130 give Taft 4415, Wilson 5177, Roosevelt 7816.

California.—The Sixth Congressional district, 53 precincts out of 296 in Alameda county give Luttrell, Democratic, 337, Wilson, Socialist 2107.

Seattle, Wash.—The Progressive chairman claims the state goes to Roosevelt by 45,000.

Santa Cruz, Cal.—Scattering precincts give Wilson 577, Roosevelt 527.

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
