APPLE SHOW DATE IS NEAR

BIGGEST THING OF ITS KIND YET IS THE PROMISE.

Proper Care of Great Exhibits Chief Problem Now.

Spokane, Wash., November 8.—(Special)—Exhibits from practically all apple-growing districts in the Pacific northwest, and many from more remote points, will make the fifth National Apple Show in Spokane, November 11 to 17, the most representative ever held.

The management has received assurances of exhibits from all important districts, and the opinion is held that 4,000,000 apples, or twice the number at any previous National Apple show, will be on display. Both the Wenatchee and North Yakima valleys are preparing to place a number of carloads, in addition to numerous box and plate displays. Proportionately large entries will come from the other districts.

"It is now merely a matter of taking care of the exhibits at the apple exposition," says Chairman W. T. Day of the board of trustees. "The exhibits already pledged are sufficient to assure the largest show in our history."
