COOK SPEECH IS FASCINATING

HAS WIDE FIELD OF INTERESTING SUBJECTS.

Land of Long Nights, the Dash, Etc. Discussed.

Speaking of Dr. Cook, the explorer who comes to La Grande under the auspices of the La Grande Chamber of Commerce, his representative said while in La Grande:

Dr. Cook's narrative is intensely interesting. As he proceeds, the fascinations of the north seize the listener with thrills of a new world of crystal glory. We follow the plucky American over 4000 miles of heaving icy waters to a scene of floating crystal and over snow-covered plains and mountains, moving fields of ice, which surround the magic spot—the north pole. It is a journey of as hazardous a nature as was ever undertaken by adventurous man. Beautiful word pictures are painted of the sunset of 1907 and the magnificent sunrise of 1908. The long twilight was spent in hunting and in the gray gloom he tells of the Eskimo spirits of the dead. Altogether, Dr. Cook's work ranks high as a literary and scientific record, not merely for the data it contains, but from all that relates to the vegetable, mineral and animal kingdom in this bleak region of ice and death.
