Lawrence Y. Sherman.
Lawrence Y. Sherman, the choice of the Republican party in Illinois to succeed Shelby M. Cullom in the United States senate, was born in Miami county, Ohio, November 8, 1858. Less than a year later he was taken by his parents to Illinois, which state has been his home ever since. At the age of sixteen he went to work on his father's farm and for several years all the schooling he had was acquired through his own efforts from books. With money earned by helping his neighbors through the threshing season he was enabled to attend McKendree college, where he graduated in law in 1882. Within a few years he was elected city attorney of Macomb, Illinois which position proved to be a stepping-stone to the office of county judge. After one term on the bench Judge Sherman returned to the practice of his profession and soon was rated as one of the leading lawyers of central Illinois. He became a member of the Illinois house of representatives in 1896 and later served as lieutenant-governor of the state. Congratulations to: Henry E. Burnham, United States
