They reached the county a couple of weeks ago and were set up ready for work, but still one thing was lacking—oil of a special quality for the bearings. This arrived Monday afternoon and R. L. Forsythe at once went to work making the connections.

A new service means day current for Wallowa and Lostine and for farmers along the line. The old plant at Lostine will be dismantled at once, as that city will be supplied with power and light from the through line.—Enterprise-Record Chieftain.
