HUNTERS RETURN WITH MANY
DEER.

Three Parties Get Fifteen Bucks in
Chesnimnus and on Snake.

The close of the open season for deer last Thursday saw many Wallowa county hunters breaking up camp, with abundant proof of their skill. Three parties report 15 deer. George Crow of Innaha and Alvin E. Jordan of Enterprise went out about two weeks ago. When camped on Deer creek they met Walter Makin and Jack Johnson and the four united into one party. They hunted on the breaks of Snake river, on Horse creek and Grizzley ridge, and got 10 deer, the largest a six point buck that dressed 300 pounds. This equals the largest buck killed in the county this fall. Alvin Jordan returned home last Friday.

This party was particularly fortunate in having Jack Johnson along. He is 62 years old and when a young man was an Indian scout. He laid out the trail the hunters traveled and named the creek, ridges and other places. That was 34 years ago, but he still knows the country like a book.
