NO OFFERINGS, HOWEVER, NOTED LOCALLY.

Hog Prices Drop Trifle, Top Prices Going Down to \$6.55.

TURKEYS OPEN AT 18c.

While Portland and local markets have been sparring for days to get a price started on Thanksgiving turkey trade, nothing has been determined until today when a quotation of 18 cents, buying price, was announced. Like the Portland markets, there are no offerings yet from the producers.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 12.—According to the South Water street commission merchants the Thanksgiving turkey this year is likely to cost the housewife from 30 to 35 cents a pound, or more than double the prevailing prices of a year ago. The turkeys for the Chicago market come from all over the West and South, many of them from as far as Texas and the Dakotas. The cold war months of last spring are reported to have caused a short crop throughout nearly all of this section.

Hogs have taken another drop and fancy cuts will soon be down where a semi-millionaire will be able to buy some occasionally, probably. Light hogs, the choice kind, bring \$6.85, which heavy ordinary grades receiving \$6.00.
