CURRENT TOPIC DISCUSSED.

Writer Complains at Rates Charged by Local Electric Company.

La Grande, Oregon, Nov. 12.—(The Editor Evening Observer)—My article in a recent issue of your good paper has brought to me information regarding what other communities are paying for their electric current which in no case has been nearly as much as we are paying and it is un-

derstood that the prices charged include paying interest on some watered stock in most instances. Figures received from points close home show that we are paying entirely too much on the rate of 15c per kilowatt in that Walla Walla gets their light and power at 10c for the first thirty kilowatts and 8c for the first thirty kilowatts and 8c for all above that amount used. Eugene, Oregon, gets their current at 9c per kilowatt. Since the appearance of my former article

I have been accosted on the streets by people who are laboring under the opinion that the corporation now furnishing La Grande and the Grande Ronde valley light and power have an exclusive franchise in the city of La Grande and I wish to set aright those who so believe. I having obtained information from the city recorder that no exclusive franchise exists. This fact leaves the way clear for the city to proceed to make its own power and thereby save an immense amount of money monthly to be spent among us rather than to be sent out of town to stockholders in a foreign corporation. Candidates for city offices should be questioned regarding their attitude along this line and those who favor saving thousands of dollars annually for the city plan should be supported and elected.

IVANHOE WRITES THE GOVERNOR

States Plainly His Attitude on North Powder Matter.

Since the Mayor of North Powder wrote in to Governor West assailing Prosecuting Attorney Ivanhoe the latter has received a letter from Governor West inquiring into the matter. In reply Colonel Ivanhoe sent the Governor the following letter: Honorable Oswald West, Governor, Salem, Oregon.

My Dear Governor:—It is only by reason of my faith in your personal sincerity that induces me to reply to yours of recent date, enclosing a copy of the complaint written you by the mayor of North Powder.

In the case he referred to I was guilty of doing and saying what I will repeat, under similar circumstances. And, in doing so, I'll not consult the mayor of North Powder, or anyone else.

Not only so. While district attorney, I will not attempt, either directly or indirectly, to influence the action of any grand jury in returning, or failing to return, an indictment in any case. This is their exclusive duty—not mine. The mayor of North Powder, if in my place, would unlawfully usurp, or attempt to unlawfully usurp, the duties required by law to be performed by the grand jury. This does not surprise me.

BAKER PICKED SURE WINNER

PENDLETON BACKS WILL MEET STONE WALL.

Game at Baker Friday Is Attracting Much Football Attention.

All interest in a football way is centered this week in Eastern Oregon in the Friday game between Pendleton and Dakr. Coach Caylor of the La Grande squad, having seen both teams at work, predicts a victory for Baker over Pendleton by one or possibly two touchdowns. While the difference in scores between the La Grande-Pendleton and Baker-La Grande games don't carry this out, he bases his opinion on the showings of the opponents and not of his own men. The La Grander lost all track of football in the Baker game at times, and had nowhere near the ginger and effectiveness that they had in the Pendleton game.

"Fat," says the mentor of the locals, "Baker has a powerful line that will stop the Pendleton backs on line plunges and anybody who saw the game here knows that their fakes play and end runs can be broken up—we spilled them for heavy losses frequently. Hence it follows that with Baker's line sufficient and mighty, Pendleton has a hard proposition to handle. It should be a great game."
