A forward pass from Hinderman in the second half was intercepted by Finley of Baker who raced 40 yards for a touchdown and Herbert kicked the goal that won the game and championship for Baker.

Pendleton Scores in Third.
With the score against them Pendleton settled down and scored in the third quarter but didn't kick goal, and lost the game as a consequence.

Freak Play Used.
In the initial kickoff Pendleton left an end on the sideline wearing a heavy sweater and a cap, and on the first down raced but on the field proper and took a neat pass of 30 yards. Throughout the first half Baker's powerful line smothered Pendleton's line plays and forward passes were resorted to freely, being successful six out of eight times in the first half. Fennell of Pendleton missed an easy chance for a touchdown by dropping the ball back of Baker's line when he attempted to

take a forward pass in the Baker 10-yard zone but missed the ball. Later in the game Herbert of Baker did much the same thing, and in the same spot exactly after the goal chance.

Pendleton scored after the ball had been carried almost the length of the field on successful forward passes which Baker could not stop. Baker held for two downs and then a delayed pass was used and McDonald, Pendleton's left end went over for a touchdown. Hinderman missed a difficult goal.

In the fourth quarter Pendleton's shift play, the same as used against La Grande, smashed down the Baker line which was weakening and the five yard line was reached when Baker braced. A place kick then was tried and failed by inches. Time was taken out by Baker's men several times in the last quarter and Pendleton was unable to get within striking distance again. The game was hard fought all the way, the big surprise being the way Pendleton worked the forward pass time after time. Full-back Hinderman threw the ball into the waiting hands with great accuracy for good gains. Herbert the crack Baker half, was used at end in order to save him as he was still suffering from the La Grande-Baker injuries. A reception was tendered the visitors after the game.

On the whole, Pendleton's brilliant open field work brands them as a trifle the better team, and at the very least should have tied Baker. Baker players admitted this fact after the game, and gave the lucky fortune of a missed goal to thank for it.

The great Indian athlete today gave his answer after taking a week to decide, and his decision is bringing joy to the hearts of the club supporters for, when Motanic is in condition, he is almost as good as Jim Thorpe, the Carlisle Indian who has won the name of being the greatest athlete the world has ever produced.

"He play football all right," he said this morning to Deputy Sheriff Geo. Strand who has been commissioned with the task of persuading him to join the football squad. He left today for Lapwai, Idaho, but will return next Wednesday, after which he says he will commence training to get into condition for the game. Motanic has a way all his own in developing wind and strength for a physical contest. He declares he takes his race horse out into the open, takes a firm grip of its mane in one hand and with the other slaps the animal and urges it into a fast run while he bounds along by its side. Though somewhat strenuous, Motanic believes it is the best and quickest way to accomplish results.

Asked what position he wished to play, Motanic expressed a preference for tackle and tackle he will be. Those who have seen his feats of strength declare him to be one of the strongest men muscularly in the country and this strength together with an amazing speed make him a feared man in the moleskins.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

Shipment of Venison Being Held.

Through the vigilance of Game Warden E. F. Averill a 65 pound shipment of venison is now held here and Nick Leathers, of Hardman, Morrow county, faces arrest for having broken the law by having venison in his possession during the closed season and having shipped the same says the Pendleton East Oregonian. The meat was consigned to F. B. Swayze, Hermiston banker, and but for the fact the shipment was intercepted before reaching its destination Mr. Swayze would also be subject to prosecution.

Through the aid of his Morrow county deputy Averill learned yesterday of the shipment of the deer. Thinking the venison would reach Hermiston yesterday by express Averill called Justice of the Peace McKenzie by phone and had a special constable at the depot to seize the meat. Meanwhile, Averill himself made the run to Hermiston in an automobile in order to take charge of the case in person. Through a mistake on the part of the express messenger the deer meat was brought to Pendleton instead of being left at Hermiston.

Running back to Pendleton through the rain Averill laid hold upon the

shipment and found it to be the best parts of a big buck. He has given instructions for the arrest of Leathers and turned the case over to District Attorney Van Vactor. Under the law Leathers, if found guilty, is open to a fine of from \$50 to \$250 and to imprisonment.

Who will get the venison is a point not yet settled. It may be donated to the hospital, the disposal of the meat resting with the justice of the peace at Heppner.
