ORDINANCE NO. 662, SERIES 1912.

An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Hemlock street from the south property line of Adams avenue to the north property line of Washington avenue, determining the property benefited hereby; levying an assessment thereon to defray the costs and expenses of the improvement; providing for the assessment roll of the same and directing the entry of said assessments in the docket of city liens; providing the time when the same shall become delinquent and requiring the city recorder to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the assessments herein levied and to collect said assessments.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the council has considered the proposed assessment of the property benefited by the improving of Hemlock street from the south property line of Adams avenue to the north property line of Washington avenue, and all objections made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in the manner provided by resolution duly passed by the council on the 26th day of June, 1912, to be the sum of \$1603.99 and the property hereafter described is specially benefited and the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or parcel thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district and which is so specially benefited by reason of said improvement and which has been equitably apportioned among all lots or parcels of land bounding, fronting on or contiguous to such improvement to the extent of the benefits to such lots, parts of lots or land by reason of such improvement and in no case in excess of said benefits and the amount set opposite the description or number of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land for which said respective parcel is assessed as follows:

and the recorder of the city of La Grande is hereby directed to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the foregoing assessment and enter the said assessment in the docket of city liens.

Section 2. It is further provided that said assessment shall become due and payable immediately after the same is entered in the docket of city liens, and delinquent within ten days thereafter.

Section 3. When the recorder of the city of La Grande shall have completed the special assessment roll in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, he shall without delay give at least five days' notice in one or more of the newspapers having a general circulation in said city of the time when said assessments may be paid in installments, provided each property owner will make application therefor within ten days from the date of the first publication of said notice, said application to be made under and by virtue of the provisions of chapter 5, Title 26, L. O. L.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the mayor and publishing in one issue of the Evening Observer.

Passed the common council this 13th day of November, 1912, by eight councilmen voting therefor.

EGGS GO UP 5C PER DOZEN

"NOT A FRESH EGG IN TOWN" IS THE CRY.

Storage Eggs Continue Plentiful With Quotations at Thirty-five Cents.

TURNIP SETS RECORD.

Big sunflowers, potatoes, lang-stemmed oats and what not may have their innings but it is a turnip right now that has stepped into the limelight. M. Clark, a rancher, living south of La Grande, raised a turnip that weighed nine pounds and two ounces. This enormous size and weight was attained in two months' growth, another startling feature about it.

"Our kingdoms for fresh eggs" is the cry of local merchants. Several stores went through last Saturday without a single fresh egg on hand and commenced the present week in the same condition. In the meantime the price has been shunted up five cents for the fresh varieties though there are sufficient quantities of the storage eggs to meet demands and the price for that grade remains at 35 cents. The shortage of fresh eggs comes earlier this year than usual, notwithstanding that the egg production in the county should be doubled by the general increase of "eggeries." Those who know say the early letup of laying is due to peculiar local conditions that have not been properly handled and when the poultrymen become familiar with the best methods of feeding and raising chickens in this climate, there should be a good winter supply.
