PLENTY TURKEY MEAT PROMISED

END OF WEEK TO SEE FIRST SHIPMENTS.

As Demands Increase Supply Will Come In, Say the Dealers.

Plenty of turkey will be hung on the pegs between now and the end of the week to meet early orders for Turkey day meat, and before Thanksgiving actually arrives, there will be sufficient on the supply boards to meet demands. This is the confidence expressed by local dealers today. The price has not been shifted from its original point, 18 cents, but the trading has not started and by the end of the week there may be changes.
