FIRE CAR IS GIVEN TESTS

ALARM BRINGS OUT CAR IN A HURRY

Twelve Blocks, Three Turns and a Hill, in 1 Min. 40 Sec. Job.

Marked success attended the first trial speed run and efficiency test of the La Grande fire department this afternoon when a test alarm from the corner of Main and Walnut saw the fire car go 12 blocks, make three turns and climb the steep Main street hill in one minute and 40 seconds. That time is reckoned from the second that the alarm bell commenced to make one complete round of signals—in other words had tapped the signal of 35; three taps and five. The machine was cranked up and started after that but time went on from the tap of the first gong.

Commissioners George Henry and A. Finley of the city administration at Baker, and Fire Chief Frank Grabner of the Baker fire department, were in La Grande today to inspect the test of the fire fighting system in this city. Following that run the car was taken out on poor surface streets that the visitors might get a better test of her strength.

of the north. "The explorations which we have been making in the polar regions have their useful side," he said, "for to my mind these regions will some day be utilized by the people of the earth. As they are now they are habitable within 500 miles of the pole. There is grass and flow-

ers there, coal, iron and copper, an abundance of animal life and the sea is pregnant with life much more abundant and more more rich than are the tropical seas. It is only a matter of time until institutions for the scientific propagation of furbearing animals must be established and it will be the arctic zone where this will be done."

The explorer was modest in speaking of his achievements during 20 years spent in the ice lands. In speaking of the famous Cook-Peary controversy he said:

"I have given 20 years of the best part of my life to polar explorations,

enduring hardships far beyond the possibility of description. After all my efforts the government and other scientific bodies were reluctant to agree with me that my fortitude had been crowned with success. The only redress I have is to talk to the fair-minded people of the United States, a few hundred at a time, from the public stage. I will be content to have the public decide for itself but only after I have had the opportunity of presenting my side of the case. We found no hat or coat rack at the pole on which we could hang our clothes or nail the stars and stripes and lay absolute claim that

we had discovered the pole."

"Of course," continued Dr. Cook, "I naturally hope that the citizens of La Grande feel interested enough that they will be represented at my lecture tonight. I know many are prejudiced against me, but they are just the ones I like to have present."
