Bittulthie Paving Has Been a Decided
Factor in the Up-Building of
Municipalities.

Bittulthie paving has played an important part in the up-building of Western Canadian cities and the streets in Calgary on which hit has been laid are illustrations of the high standard of quality which it has uniformly maintained. It has contributed as much toward making Calgary a modern municipality as any individual factor. The general traffic of the city seems to discriminate in favor of the streets where bittulthie is laid. The keenest observers have made a study of this paving here and elsewhere, and they have admitted, sometimes against their will, that it stands for all that is desirable in connection with a modern roadway. The contracts for the present season (1912) amount to more than 500,000 square yards, the total for the six years ending 1912 being more than 1,000,000. 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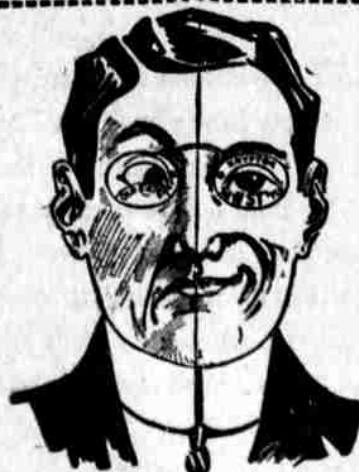
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
